





1493-1600s: Portugal and Spain colonize Malacca, Macau and the Philippines

1637: Shimbara Rebellion—Shogun drives Europeans out of Japan




1800s: colonization by Britain and France




1853, 1854: Commodore Perry visits Japan

1897-1898: colonization by Germany and United States




1905: Russo-Japanese War






















