



















PICTURE OF HISTORY

The Capture of an American Guerrilla

DURING THE Fall of Bataan and Corregidor (April and May, 1942), most of the officers of the U.S. Army in the Philippines surrendered and became prisoners-of-war. Some, however, escaped capture and began organizing guerrilla units in the mountains. Among these may be mentioned Thorpe, Laplum, Cuadriga, Ferring, Voldmann, Barnes, Anderson and Straughn.

The leader of these American guerrilla leaders was Col. Hugh Straughn, who was already about 60 years old when the Pacific War broke out. He was a retired U.S. army officer, who owned some 1,500 acres in the mountains of Rizal province. As he was with army intelligence before the outbreak of the war, and had extensive knowledge of the area around Manila, he was asked by General Douglas MacArthur to organize the guerrillas. Straughn's outfit became known as the U.S.-American Irregular Troops (FACT). It drew its members from Rizal, Laguna, Tayabas, Bataan and Nueva Ecija.

One time his headquarters was in Quino, a barrio of Pilita, Bataan.

When Brigadier General Manuel A. Roxas was brought to Manila from the POW camp in Malaybalay and, despite Japanese vigilance, was able to contact many guerrilla leaders, one of the men with whom he had a rendezvous in the mountains was Colonel Straughn. Roxas' object in contacting as many guerrilla chiefs as possible was to coordinate their work and to see if one could be named overall chief. By age and rank, Straughn was picked as the logical overall guerrilla commander in Luzon.


But one day a Japanese army unit chanced on Colonel Straughn. He tried to escape, as evidenced by a small wound he sustained in the head when he fell off a precipice, but his escape route was sealed. The regenerated guerrilla column was captured, in the great exultation of the Japanese army.









































